



# Russell Quigley, DVM

**Russell Quigley, DVM**, received his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree, with distinction, from the Ontario Veterinary College in 2004. After finishing his veterinary degree, he completed a 1-year small animal rotating internship at the Ontario Veterinary College followed by a 3-year residency in neurology/neurosurgery at a private practice in Phoenix, AZ (Veterinary Neurological Center). Dr. Quigley subsequently became board-certified in neurology in

2008 by the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (ACVIM). He joined the neurology service of Oakland Veterinary Referral Services in August 2008.

Dr. Quigley's main research has focused on the intracranial manifestations of the fungal organism *Coccidioides immitis* that is endemic to the southwestern United States. He subsequently presented an oral abstract on the Intracranial Manifestations of Coccidioidomycosis during the annual ACVIM forum in Seattle, 2007. Dr. Quigley has also authored a paper reporting the first documented case of a green algal infection in a dog. The paper is titled Multisystem Chlorellosis Involving the Spinal Meninges of a Dog and is currently published in the Journal of Veterinary Pathology.

Dr. Quigley has extensive training in both medical and surgical neurology, including seizure disorders, intervertebral disc disease, brain and spinal tumors, neuromuscular disorders, and congenital brain and spinal malformations. He is currently a member of the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) and the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (ACVIM).
