Dr. Curtis Cathcart received his DVM from the Western College of Veterinary Medicine (Saskatoon, Canada) in 1999. He ran a general small animal practice on the west coast of Canada until 2006, at which point he decided to pursue his interest in surgery. Surgical internships in Texas and California led to a position as research associate at the University of Georgia studying canine gait analysis and pain management. Dr. Cathcart then did his residency in small animal surgery at Metropolitan Veterinary Hospital in Akron, Ohio attaining board certification by the American College of Veterinary Surgeons in 2015. Prior to joining OVRS, Dr. Cathcart was assistant professor of small animal surgery at the University of Saskatchewan.

Dr. Cathcart's areas of interest include: orthopedic surgery and arthroscopy as well as airway and thoracic surgery. He has published research on several pain medications, drug effects on platelet function, compartment syndrome, and ground work for canine knee replacement.
