Michele Sauerbrey, DVM is a Michigan native, born in Southfield. She attended Michigan State University where she completed and received a Bachelor of Science degree in 1992 and her Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree in 1997. Dr. Sauerbrey's collection of awards and recognitions obtained during her four year veterinary degree include: The Phi Zeta Award for Academic Excellence (1997) and The Jean M. Davis Foundation Scholarship (1996 & 1997). After graduating from Michigan State University, she worked in Michigan for one year as a general practitioner followed by three years working in emergency medicine at a local referral hospital. While working in emergency medicine, she became interested in the work up and stabilization of oncology patients. This interest led to her work at the Animal Cancer and Imaging Center where she has completed a formal oncology internship in 2004 and a medical oncology residency in 2006. *Her research has involved the development of new chemotherapy protocols for the treatment of canine lymphoma patients.* Dr. Sauerbrey is board certified by the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine in Oncology.

Her research has involved the development of new chemotherapy protocols for the treatment of canine lymphoma patients. She is the first veterinary oncologist in Michigan to offer Electrochemotherapy as a treatment option for various tumor types. Electrochemotherapy is a local treatment for cancer using a combination of chemotherapy and electric pulse therapy, increasing the antitumor effect of the chemotherapy drugs.
